

Specialty Pharmacy Benefit Program Information

DuPont has partnered with Archimedes to administer specialty medication management. Archimedes offers high touch clinical and safety programs designed for the unique needs of patients taking these complex and costly medications. What is a specialty medication?

Specialty medications are generally prescribed for people with complex or ongoing medical conditions such as multiple sclerosis, hemophilia and rheumatoid arthritis. These high cost medications also have one or more of the following characteristics:

- injected or infused, but some may be taken by mouth
- unique storage or shipment requirements
- additional education and support required from a health care professional
- typically not stocked at retail pharmacies

What pharmacy can I use to fill my specialty medication?

Most specialty medications will still need to be filled and distributed by CVS Specialty Pharmacy. CVS Specialty is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. A small number of specialty medications are limited distribution drugs that can not be filled at CVS Specialty. If you are taking a limited distribution drug, Archimedes will connect you to a pharmacy that can dispense your medication. HIV medications can be filled through CVS or by a retail pharmacy in Archimedes' network. You may contact Archimedes to locate a participating pharmacy.

Who do I contact for a prior authorizations?

Many specialty medications will require prior authorization before they can be dispensed, which will be managed by Archimedes. If you have questions about the status of your prior authorization request, please contact Archimedes at 1-888-439-0704.













How do I enroll in a copay assistance program?

Many specialty medications have copay assistance programs where a drug manufacturer pays for all or part of the drug's cost to make it more affordable. These programs offer significant savings for both the plan and members. If you do not currently use a copay assistance program, Archimedes will help you enroll so you can take advantage of these savings. If you fill a prescription for a specialty drug and use a manufacturer copay assistance program to reduce your out-of-pocket cost for the drug, only the actual amount you pay will count toward any medical plan deductible and out-of-pocket maximum. What ID card should I use when filling my specialty medications?

You will not receive a separate ID card for Archimedes. CVS Specialty has all the information needed to fill and ship your specialty medication which has been approved by Archimedes. If you are filling a limited distribution drug at another specialty pharmacy or an HIV medication at a retail pharmacy, Archimedes' information can be found on your CVS Caremark card.
